## Strengths of the Site

- All entries are tagged by category so a visitor can easily find relevant information by grade level or subject area.
- Kharbach writes entries on all sorts of educational topics: classroom management, colleague relationships
- Information is up to date and helpful with Kharbach's own reviews of tools/ideas/sites.
- "Teacher Guide" tab offers practical ideas on integrating technology/Web 2.0 skills into the classroom.

## Weaknesses of the site

- The homepage is a little busy, there are so many different ways the entries are organized, it is a little confusing at first.
- Kharbach heavily encourages advertising on his site so the ads are very prevalent.
