




### What's a ThingLink?

An interactive media platform that lets creators and viewers to explore a topic through rich media links to photos, videos, and websites.




### So what do I have to do first?

1. You have only two questions to answer about your conflict: What was it—How was it solved. So answer these questions first. You can even write the answers on the back of this wks.
2. You need to collect online resources through which you will share your answers with your fellow students. In other words, you AREN'T just telling your fellow students the answers, you are LEADING them to find the answers for themselves. These resources can be pictures, webpages, or videos.
3. Make your ThingLink. Download the app from the App Store. Choose a background image. Link your resources.



### Why do we have to make a ThingLink?

Because it's less boring than writing a paper. Plus it makes you use a different part of your brain, which is important to me as your teacher. Plus, when you share your ThingLinks your fellow students will have to use their brains in a different way, too. So I think that's pretty cool. Sorry if you disagree!
