1. Evernote



-No more forgetting notes in your locker or saved on a different computer. Now students and teachers can access notes in the cloud from any machine.

2. Dipity

-This online timeline tool can serve as a great assessment and instructional tool. Students can create their own interactive timeline of historical events allowing a teacher to assess both historical and technological skills. Teachers can also create timelines to use as introductions to new units. It can engage student curiosity and excitement in the new unit.

3. Blabberize



-This tool allows students and teachers to animate the mouths of pictures to make them appear as though they were talking. What a great way to let history "speak for itself"!

4. Tubechop



-This is a great tool for maximizing learning time while showing a YouTube video. Sometimes the content of a YouTube video is inappropriate or provides superfluous information. Tubechop will allow a teacher or student to edit a video from YouTube for their purposes.
